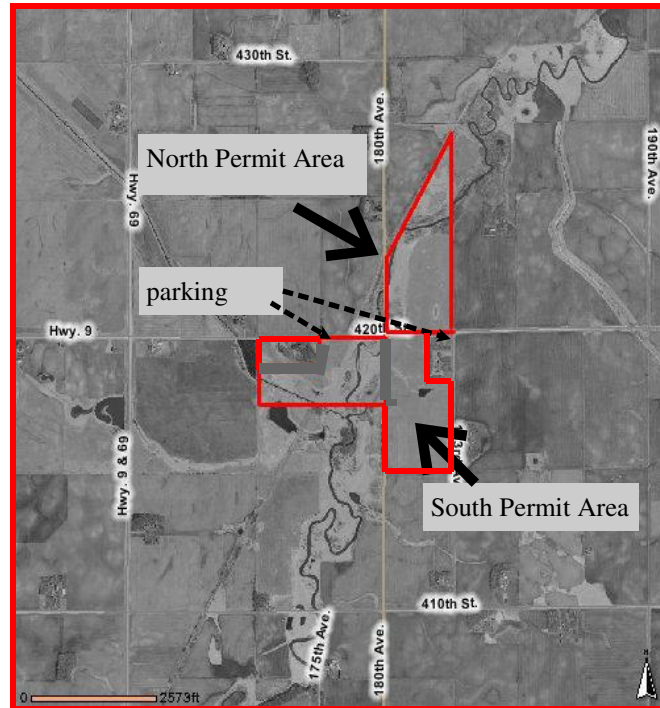

Rules & Regulations:

1. **Special use permit must be obtained and approved by the county conservation board office prior to hunting.**
2. Permit must be displayed so that it's visible from outside the vehicle.
3. Permit is not transferable.
4. Maximum of 4 persons.
Minimum of 2 (1 adult and 1 youth).
Youth must be 15 years old or under.
Adult must be 21 years old.
5. The two permit times are from 1 hour before opening time through noon and from noon to 1 hour after closing time.
6. Park your vehicle in designated areas only.
7. Honor all boundaries.
8. Leave remains of field cleaned game at least 50 yards from parking and roads.
9. Permit and survey card must be returned to the Winnebago County Conservation Board office before another permit before another permit will be issued.
10. The Conservation Board reserves the right to issue or deny approval of a permit.
11. All State of Iowa Games Laws apply.
12. Use non-toxic shot only except for turkey and deer hunting.

Safety Tips:

- Treat every gun as if it were loaded.
- Always point gun in safe direction.
- Be sure of your target.
- Carry your gun in a safe manner.
- Make sure your gun is in good working order.
- Respect private property.
- No shooting within 200 yards of occupied buildings.

Purpose of Area:

Holland Prairie Conservation & Youth Hunting Area

The area was established to increase the number of youths participating in wildlife and hunting activities and to preserve the hunting heritage for present and future generations.

History of Area:

The Holland farm has been in the family for over 100 years. Thanks to the generosity of sister's Martha Olson and Diane Rickerl (Acorn Associates, L.C.) and brother Daniel Holland the property has been leased to the Winnebago County Conservation Board to be used to benefit youth. The area is 225 acres of restored prairie uplands, Winnebago River bottom, oak savannah and several wetlands. Hunters can expect to encounter deer, pheasant, wild turkey, waterfowl and other small game. No trapping is allowed on the area.
